THE NEED

Marin is home to more than 48,000 people who worry about where their next meal will come from. Yet tons of fresh food are wasted every week in our community, and food waste rotting in landfills is a main cause of the climate crisis.

ExtraFood rescues excess fresh food from any North Bay business and immediately delivers it to our nonprofit distribution partners. Together we serve our community's most vulnerable children, seniors and families.

Hunger and food waste are solvable problems in our community, and ExtraFood is solving hunger differently. We are leading a movement to transform the food system: from wasting food to donating it for people in need.

HOW IT WORKS



A business or school contacts us with a minimum of 10 servings (or 10 pounds) of excess fresh food to donate in food-safe, disposable containers. They specify a day and time range for pick-up in Marin.



Considering the type of food, quantity of food, and pick-up day/time, we find the best match for the donation among our many recipient partners. We always know who needs what and when! We confirm the pick-up with the donor, and an ExtraFood volunteer signs up online to pick up and deliver the food (or we dispatch our staff drivers in our refrigerated truck or van).



The volunteer picks up the donation, if necessary loading it into a sealed industrial-grade food delivery bag with ice packs. The volunteer then drives directly to the recipient, with no stops or detours, and always in under 30 minutes.

WHY WE DO IT



- 1 in 5 people in Marin are foodinsecure, in normal times, with the need having skyrocketed during COVID
- More than 10,000 children in Marin live in food-insecure households
- As many as 12,000 seniors in Marin cannot make ends meet



- 35% of all food is wasted in the U.S.
- Food is the most plentiful material in landfills
- 14% of all freshwater in the U.S. is used to produce our wasted food each year



- Decaying food in landfills releases methane, warming the planet 86x the rate of carbon dioxide
- If global food waste were a country, it would rank 3rd in greenhouse gas emissions after China and the U.S.



 Increasing equitable access to healthy, fresh food enables hungry kids to learn, struggling adults to find jobs, and vulnerable seniors to age in place with dignity

OUR IMPACT

- Reaching 8,000 people every week
- Rescued 6 million pounds of food to date
- Prevented nearly 500K pounds of methane from warming the planet -- equivalent to eliminating the emissions from 12 million driving miles
- Established 41 new food programs
- Created 90,000 meals with our restaurant and catering partners during COVID through our Community Meals Program
